## DONOR BILL OF RIGHTS

The Full Frame Initiative raises a significant portion of its funding from the public and from donor institutions. If you are a donor to the Full Frame Initiative, you have the following rights:

- 1. To be informed of the Full Frame Initiative's mission, of the way the organization intends to use donated resources, and of its capacity to use donations effectively for their intended purposes.
- 2. To be informed of the identity of those serving on the Full Frame Initiative's governing board, and to expect the board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
- 3. To have access to the Full Frame Initiative's most recent audited financial statements.
- 4. To be assured your gifts will be used for the purposes for which they were given.
- 5. To receive appropriate acknowledgement and recognition.
- 6. To be assured that information about your donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality to the extent provided by law.
- 7. To expect that all relationships with individuals representing organizations of interest to the donor will be professional in nature.
- 8. To be informed whether those seeking donations are volunteers, employees of the organization or hired solicitors.
- 9. To have the opportunity for your name to be promptly deleted from mailing lists and other distribution lists.
- 10. To feel free to ask questions when making a donation and to receive prompt, truthful and forthright answers.
